



Financial trends

- 2015 drop from GR Centennial exhibits, displays, banquet, ...
- Student travel grants
 - Biggest annual expense
 - 2017: \$5,900
 - 2018 projection: \$8,600
 - This is after reducing grant from \$300 to \$200
 - Large increase in applicants



The Solution

- Establish an endowment --- the DGRAV
 Student Travel Grant fund --- to supplement
 the DGRAV budget for this purpose
- Target: to raise \$75,000 (< \$50 per member) to provide \$3,000 per year;
- Result: would allow more grants or larger grants
